2021-2022 Fact Sheet





The Interim Measure of Student Success and Achievement (iMSSA) assessments are state supported interim in Reading, Language Usage, and Mathematics. This is an optional interim assessment provided statewide by PED.





Who takes the iMSSA in 2021-2022?

The iMSSA is an interim assessment available to all students in grades 3-8. It is available for administration three times a year (BOY, MOY, and EOY) in Reading, Language Usage, and Mathematics. This is an optional interim assessment with an exception for K5+ programs.



What does the test measure?

The iMSSA assessments target college- and career- readiness content standards in Reading, Writing & Language, and Mathematics. They evaluate students' knowledge and skills relative to a specific set of academic goals in order to inform decisions at the classroom, school, and district levels. They are designed to measure progress towards on-grade level proficiency.



When is the test given?

There are three windows for iMSSA administration and can be accessed by the <u>Online Interactive</u> Calendar for all assessment administration and training dates.



How is the test administered?

The iMSSA will be administered on computer, in three sessions, in English and in Spanish for math. The assessment will include accessibility features and accommodations to support diverse student needs.
