New Mexico Assessment of Science Readiness (NM-ASR) Summative Assessment

Last Updated 4/3/2023.

General Assessment Questions

- Do I have to order my online testing materials using the online ordering tool?
 - Yes, you will need to order both paper-based and computer-based test materials.
- > How will I receive student pre-ID labels for my paper testers?
 - There was a window for DTCs to identify paper testers in the iTester online portal from January 26 through February 3, 2023.
 - If you missed that window and did not identify any paper testers during the above time window, you will not receive printed pre-ID labels with the shipment of your paper test materials.
 - If you have paper testers who do not receive a pre-ID label, follow the instructions in the Test Administrator's Manual (TAM) to fill in the student information on the answer document using the bubbles on the biogrids.

Materials are scheduled to arrive by March 13, 2023, when we are on winter break. Can I get materials sooner?

- Materials will not be released earlier.
- UPS will make three attempts at delivery before returning them to Cognia.



Please make every attempt to have someone there for one of those deliveries.

• Manuals will be posted to the <u>Help and Support</u> site prior to that date for early access to the TAM for training purposes.

Should my students who are scheduled to take a DLM assessment also be scheduled for an NM-ASR assessment?

 No. Please be sure that any students scheduled for DLM are not scheduled to take an assessment for NM-ASR. This will avoid any duplicate records for the student.

What do I do if I have a student with incorrect demographics in the iTester portal?

• Except for state student ID number, all demographic information can



be edited in the iTester portal. Please complete all edits prior to May 12, 2023, when testing administration window ends for NM-ASR, to ensure accurate student demographic information.

> How many sessions does the NM-ASR test have?

- 3 sessions for each grade, 5, 8, 11 for both English and Spanish versions

> What is the Cepstral Spanish language pack? Do I need this?

- The Spanish language pack is specifically needed for the Spanish text-tospeech online testing feature, not the language version of the test.
- If you need to use the Spanish text-to-speech feature for a Windows or Mac device for either the NM-MSSA Math or NM-ASR online tests, you can now submit your request for the Cepstral voice pack by going <u>here</u>. You may expect receiving the information requested within 24 hours.
- If your students use Chromebooks, there is no need to use the Cepstral voice pack since the Spanish voice is embedded within the device.
